Transportation and Parking

Parking is available in an underground garage at the library which can be accessed from 7th Street between Santa Monica Blvd. and Arizona Ave. The structure has 525 parking spaces on three levels and is open from 8:00 am to 11:00 pm daily. Real-time parking space availability for the structure can be viewed on the City's Transportation Division [website](#). Click on "Santa Monica Public Library."

On the weekends, the first 30 minutes are free. After that, rates are \$1.00 per half hour, up to the daily maximum of \$5.00. Parking on level P1 is restricted to stays of three hours or less. Parking spaces for those displaying disabled placards or plates are on P1. Visitors parking for three hours or longer should park on levels P2 or P3. Further city parking is available around the 3rd Street Promenade on 2nd and 4th Streets between Wilshire and Colorado. See [here](#) for more information.

The library is a 5-10 minutes walk from the Downtown Santa Monica Station, the terminus of the Metro's Expo Line, which runs from Downtown Los Angeles via Exposition Blvd. and Culver City. Buses 1, 5, 7, 8, and 18 stop across the street from the library.

There are multiple dining options available in downtown Santa Monica and this is but a sample. We advise you to leave your car parked and walk or rideshare to lunch, since parking becomes much more scarce in the afternoon.
